Vienna, March 15.—That the late shah of Persia was fond of preclous stones is indicated by a dispatch from Teheran which says that an inventory has revealed that he left jewels to the value of \$50.000.000. Chief among them are diamonds. One portion of his state paraphernalia, a jewel stud-ded belt, is valued at several million dollars. It weighs 18 pounds. The famous diamond stud belt and scabbord % said to be worth \$1.250.000 and an emeraid bedecked sliver vase with one of the stones of the chah's numerous titles, engraved on it, is regarded as almost priceless. Among other treasures was found a block of pure amber, containing 400 cubic inches, which is said to have dropped from the skies on the tomb of Ma-homet. homet
