# LAST BODY RECOVERED.

# Remains of C. L. Johnson Taken From Highland Boy Cave-in.

The fifth of the five miners who were crushed on Oct. 21 last by a cave-in at the Highland Boy mine, was re-covered Saturday night, by the rescu-ers. It was C. L. Johnson, a single man aged 46. The body was in a fair state of preservation, with the features but little disfigured; but the thoracie cavity was entirely grushed in by the weight of the rock and soil resting on the body.
