

Fourteenth—We favor such legislation as will keep litigation with cor-porations doing business in this State n our State courts. \* Fifteenth-We endorse the action of he Grand Army of the Republic in their last State encampment asking that the Legislature at the next session shall pass a bill and make an appro-priation for the establishment and maintenance within the State of Iowa of a home for our disabled volunteer Soldiers and sailors. 
