THE IRISH PEOPLE.
New York, 6.—The *Herald's* London special agent, on receiving the result of a talk with a Fenian head center in Ireland. He states that when the land agitation was inaugurated determined resistance was made to it by the supporters of the Fenian propaganda. That organization then had 50,000 members paying a small weekly contribution. Scarcely had the land league movement commenced when the Fenian agitation, as an organized combination collapsed, and there was an almost immediate transference of members to the land league. The correspondent adds

there were included in the league, and the latter were the only men who had really developed into men through going to the Young Irelanders and never before lived. The writer then proceeds as follows: "Since the men who were to have been brought to the counsels, the Fenian principles have had freer play. The distribution of arms, which was ever intensely suspected, has since been made a matter of open view. A number of Sniders now scattered over the country cannot be well calculated. Any man who puts a Snider in his hands can be provided with a Snider, rifle and 100 rounds of ball and cartridge, with waist belt, snoutter belt and a couple of dozen cartridges, and a day or so for the rifle. One or two persons whose names have been before the public of late, and who are credited with the most atrocious crimes, and agitation which it has recently assumed, I mean the change toward the repeal movement, have been particularly active in distributing arms, and in carrying out the work of carrying this out are worthy of better cause. Though matters are taking this turn, the Fenians are not hopeful that the rising can be effected."

Queen Victoria's Speech to Parliament.

LONDON, 6.—The Queen, in her speech opening Parliament, said:

My Duty and Contentment.

I have called you at a period early

The ample provision by the present circumstances of the country, leads me now to approve you that the proposals will be immediately carried into effect, and that with additional powers, necessary in my judgment, not only for the vindication of order and public law, but for the protection of the life and property and personal liberty of action, subject to the primary and imperative obligation to which I have just alluded, and which I have, therefore, to prosecute the removal of grievances and the work of legislative improvement in Ireland, as well as in Great Britain. The Irish people are a brave and energetic people of great benefit and has much com-

tributed to the security and comparative wellbeing of occupiers of the soil, without diminishing the value or security of the tenure. In some respects, in some respects, however, and more particularly under the strain of recent and calamitous years, the security of the tenure has been found sufficient either in Ulster or in other provinces, to recommend that we undertake the further development of the land in a manner more conformable to the social and economic conditions of Ireland, both as regards the relation of landlord and tenant, and the view to effective efforts for the giving of security of tenure to the tenant by purchase a permanent proprietary interest in the soil. This legislation will require the removal for the purpose of the purchase of the tenant out of the limitations on ownership of property, with due provision for the security of the interests involved.
