A ROBBERY IN DAYLIGHT.

To Effect a Cut-off the C. P. R. Files a Condemnation Complaint.

A Lively Runaway in Which the Driver Was Hurt—Court Notes, Personal, Etc.

Yesterday afternoon, some time between 3 and 4 o'clock, the home of Hans C. Hansen, situated at No. 2038 Adams avenue, was entered by burglars and the rooms turned topsy-turvy by the thieves in their search for valuables. Mr. Hansen was at work, and his wife went to town to do some shopping, locking the doors and windows before leaving. The robbers picked open one of the windows and gained entrance through the same. Once in the house, the burglars, washstands, and everything was went through. They took an old-style silver watch, a Danish gold coin, and a number of old country silver coins, an 1899 High school badge, a gold breast pin and several other smaller articles. The police and sheriff were notified of the robbery and immediately started out on the hunt, but have found no trace of the robbers. Miss Hansen was returning home about 4 o'clock and saw three suspicious looking men going down 25th street, which is only about a half block from the house. She supposed that these men committed the robbery.

There seems to be a gang of these hold-up and house-breakers around the city, doing their work, and it would be well for the citizens to be very careful about leaving their house alone either night or day.
