Alexander Ramsey, of Minnesota; Algonson S. Paddock, of Nebraska; C. F. Godfrey, of Iowa; Ambrose B. Carleton, of Indiana; James R. Pettigrew, of Arkansas. The commis- sion is somewhat better than the projected tariff commission in call- ing and in public acquaintance. He was appointed by Presi- dent Taylor to be the first Territorial Governor of Minnesota in 1849. He was once Mayor of St. Paul, and Governor of the State of Minnesota later, and was also United States Senator from that State. Mr. Paddock was born in the State of New York, at Glen's Falls, where he was ad- mitted to the bar. He went to Nebraska in 1857, was made Secretary of the Territory in 1861, and held the office until the Territory was made a State in 1867. He once declined the Governorship of Wy- oming Territory. Seven years ago Nebraska sent him to the United States Senate. These men are fa- miliar with territorial affairs and have had public experience. Mr. Harlan, of Iowa, was not appointed on the commission as was expected. Ramsey and Paddock presumably have the ability to do what the com- mission may towards engineering Utah into the Union as a republican State.

C. F. Godfrey, of Iowa, is a re- publican and a lawyer. He entered the army as lieutenant in the Sec- ond Regiment of Iowa Infantry and rose to be colonel of the Eleventh Alabama Cavalry. At the close of the war he engaged in the practice of law at Des Moines, Ia., where for several years he held the position of receiver of public money, and re- cently served for several terms as assistant district attorney. He is about 42 years of age.

Ambrose B. Carleton, of Terre Haute, Ind., is a lawyer by profes- sion and a democrat in politics. He was formerly a law partner of Sena- tor Voorhees and at various times has been member of the Indiana Legislature, a circuit judge and pro- fessor of law in the State University. He is about 55 years old and is said to have a high reputation for legal ability. His appointment to a place on the commission has been strongly recommended by Mr. Gar- land and other Western members of the Senate. He is a man of middle age, a lawyer and a democ- rat.

James R. Pettigrew, of Fayette- ville, Ark., has been a member of the Legislature of that State, and is now the journal clerk of the United States Senate. Field Beans.

That this crop is neglected is evi- dent from the fact that beans sold in this market last week for \$3.75 per bushel. A few years ago the price of beans was about the same as that of wheat, and still farmers found it profitable to raise them. They raised them in many cases on land that would not produce paying crops of corn or any kind of small grain. They found the crop an economical one to raise, for the reason that the planting, cultivating and harvesting could be done at times when there was no pressing work to be performed. No costly machinery was required for culti- vating them, and no expense was incurred in thrashing them and pre- paring them for the market. During the past year, almost for the first time in the history of the country, beans have been imported in quite large quantities from Europe. There is no State or Territory in which field beans can not be raised to advantage. They come as near being a "sure crop" as any that the farmer at- tempts to raise. The plants are not generally liable to attacks of insects and are not destroyed by the wind. The crop matures quickly and is therefore less liable to be damaged than many other crops. Good bean crops are prepared for a crop of beans after the small grains are sown. The time for harvesting them occurs be- tween that of grain and potatoes and corn. They can be thrashed on the barn floor with a hand flail any time in the latter part of the fall or winter. They can be winnowed by passing them through a sieve, and then through a corn sheller. The crop is a profitable one to all farm- ers, and is especially adapted to those of small means who are not pre- pared to purchase expensive farm im- plements. Few kinds of vegetable food are as nutritious as beans. In all countries where much attention is given to economy in food beans are extensively cultivated and form a leading article of diet.—Chicago Times.

Compacting the Soil.

"How is it," once asked a young friend of us, "that every cutting you touch will grow, while only a small part of mine succeed?" We were both amateur gardeners, and as neighbors indulged in a friendly rivalry. We gave him the secret of our "touch," which was to always press the soil firmly around the cuttings; after he had no cause to complain of failure. This matter of bringing the soil in close contact not only with cuttings, but with rooted plants and seeds, is of the greatest importance, and its neglect is a frequent source of failure. If the soil is left loosely around a cutting, or around a seed, the minute root in either case, as it pushes, may fall to come in contact with the needed moist soil and perish for the want of it. When ripe wood cuttings, such as those of the currant are set out in the open ground, and have the earth thoroughly pressed against their lower portion, even pounded down to make sure, every one will grow. If this is neglected, the cuttings will fail. So in setting out plants, such as those of cabbage, celery, etc. The market gardeners make sure that the soil shall be brought close to the roots, by going along the row and pressing it firmly to the plant with the feet. In an article we printed a few years ago, Mr. Peter Henderson showed that suc- cess with raising crops of celery plants was due to the fact that after sowing the seed he had the whole surface of the soil of the bed well patted down with the back of the spade. The seed and plants on a large scale by the use of a roller, but in small beds the spade is an excellent substitute. In setting out trees or shrubs, the more carefully the soil is filled in and worked in among the roots, and firmly pressed—not stamped down, with the foot—the greater the chances of suc- cess. Even in laying turf or sods, the roots of the grass should be brought in close contact with the soil by the use of a "beater," a piece of heavy plank with a handle, or by beating down with the back of the spade.
