"Pirates of Penzance."

This celebrated comic opera is to be presented for the first time in this city, to-night, by the Emilie Melville Opera Company. From all accounts it is a most exquisite specimen of opera bouffe. Perhaps a synopsis of it would be of interest to our readers.

The next scene is laid in the vicinity of a ruined chapel by moonlight. The General, assisted by his daughters, is mourning over the fact he told the pirate about his being an orphan boy, but is consoled by Frederick, who, having gathered a squad of police, is about to descend upon and exterminate the freebooters. He and his "Mabel" are left alone to part when all at once the pirate chief and "Ruth" appear, and pointing pistols at "Frederick's" head, implore him to be merciful.
