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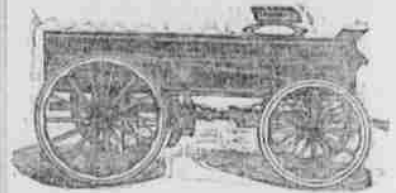

City Council.

At last night's meeting of the city council, in the matter of erecting a market house, which has been on the table for a long time, a minority report was presented by Maguire and Paine. Laid over till next meeting.

It was also a proposition to sell the city a new engine for the medical room of \$4500.

The Canning Company Fails.

The Colorado & Utah Canning company of this city did not open their doors for business this morning. The trouble is the owners were closed last night under an attachment issued from the fourth district court at the suit of Thomas G. Askew on promissory notes amounting to \$5000. Today the factory is in the hands of Marshall Kaine and his deputies.

owing to the inability of the company to raise the amount of attachment at once, the directors concluded to assign everything for the benefit of their creditors, and the papers were made out last night.

The assets and liabilities are not yet given, but they are estimated at about \$200,000 for the former and that the latter will not exceed \$40,000. The creditors are anxiously waiting. It is believed they will be paid in full.
