San Francisco, Cal., May 26 .-. "The art of slipping the double cross" was the designation applied by one of the attorneys in the trial of Patrick Calhoun in today's proceedings, and the testimony, which related to the experiences of a prosecution agent who was simultaneously employed by both sides. illustrated the objection interposed by Atty, Earl Rogers of the defense, who made the remark in question. John G Lawlor, an assistant employed by W. J. Burns, head of the prosecution's bureau of special agents, was the prin cipal witness of the day. He charged that Luther G. Brown, who had already testified to his activities in behalf of the president of the United Railroads. had employed him to supply information procured in Burns' office, and paid him a sum aggregating \$250 for his sorvices.

Lawlor stated to the jury his version of a series of meetings with Brown, and charged that the comporation's agent had several times invited him to enter Brown's bath room in the St Francis hotel where Lewlor found st. Francis note, where Lawlor found various sums of money deposited in a scap dish. The witness testified that he had taken all the money offered in this manner, and Asst. Dist. Atty. Francis J. Heney placed in evidence four envelopes, containing gold coins, which the witness said he had marked in the presence of the district attorney in the presence of the district attorney and an assistant. Twice the witness charged Luther Brown with a declara-tion that "the people behind me don't care about Abraham Ruef," and on one occasion, Lawior testified, Brown had

LOS ANGELES AFTER THE DIVORCE RECORD

Los Angeles, Cal., May 27 .- The first five months of the year 1909 show a startling increase in the relative pro-portion of divorces to marriages in Los Angeles county, figures indicating that a divorce has been granted since Jan 1 for every four marriages that had been performed. During 1908, the ratio was one to six. In San Trancisco it was one to seven. In the United States t was one to twelve. In the five months of the present year 460 interlocutory divorces and 292 final decrees have been granted in Los Angeles. The reason for the increase is explained. If the ra-tio is maintained Los Angeles will make a bid for the divorce banner of the United States for the year 1909.
