Let us train up our children in the ways of life. Let us see that they are instructed in the laws of God, and that they are kept from the spares of the adversary. Avoid corruption of every kind. Preserve our bodies pnre. Preserve our spirits pure. Be honest, up-right and virtuous. Sustain every principle that is good, everything that is calculated to lead to God, to truth, to virtue, and to the estab-What then would you do? Why, that is carcialted to lead to Good, to truth, to virtue, and to the estab-lishment of correct principles among men. God expects these things at our hands. 
