Scandinavian Banquet.

The first meeting of the Scandinavian review and conference opened in the Tabernacle on Sunday, Aug. 18. Elder John L. Smith, ex-president of the church, with several hundred persons in attendance. On the stand were Elder A. H. Lofland, of the question of Apostle O. N. Gammie; Rev. Dr. H. C. H. Johnson, with friends of the Scandinavian religious organization from various parts of the state, members of the conference committee and others. During the day the speakers were Rev. Mr. Knutson, Rev. Mr. Lund, and other leaders, most of them residents in character, leading the congregation back to earlier days where more personal interest was shown in the conference program. The speakers, however, were not all from the Scandinavian groups and review, how rustic and unpolished—were relating their early experiences in the ministry field.

The speakers on Monday morning were almost by a very much larger congregation than the meetings held yesterday. In addition to those present yesterday, President H. C. H. Johnson, and other prominent Elders were on the platform.

The speakers in the forenoon were Elders Charles Peterson, H. C. H. Johnson and H. C. Lillequist, who were addressing the audience.

In the afternoon Elder A. H. Lofland of the Question of Apostle spoke to the English language. The fact that he would not use any name in the Scandinavian language, many English-speaking people were present. Elder Lofland advised the young people of Scandinavian descent to spread Scandinavian knowledge near the home of their birth, in the country in which their parents had first been born, and pointed out the great advantage this would be to young men, who may be any time exposed to the extreme difficulties of the Scandinavian language and the great work now being done by the Missionaries in various parts of the world, while it was a fulfillment of scripture that the sons of men should be instructed as it was to all the nations, and then the man should enter. Elder Lofland also called attention to the fact that a mission school was now being organized in Scandinavia, where they will instruct the people to send them to their lands. He was followed by Elders H. C. Berg and President Partington who spoke encouraging words in the conclusion.

After the meeting contributions were received for the aid of the Scandinavian mission in Chicago.

At the commencement of the afternoon session the speaker was Elder G. J. Hart, president, with Elders H. C. H. Johnson and Lars P. Nielsen, as first and second counselors respectively, to preside over the Scandinavian Missionary Conference, appointed by President Partington and unanimously sustained by the congregation.

A Familiar Case.

A rather peculiar case of illness is that of Mrs. Dose McElroy of Avon City. She went to Chautauk Falls Saturday and spent the evening in dancing. At about 10 o'clock Sunday morning she became ill, and the doctor said she had a fever. She was sitting in the bed and was seated with a fainting spell.
