Cattle-Shipping Syndieste.

Privature, Jan. 18.—J. Chyton of Chicage, who represents a syndicate formed for the purpose of cut-rolling the live slock shipments throughout the country, is in the city. Chyton said the plan was to have all cattle and sheep shipped out of Chicage, go through Canana, and out at St. Lawrence ports. 
