Such evidences as are supplied by the miracles of our Lord are works which were proof of the divinity of His mission. He healed the sick, made the blind to see, and even raised the dead, and we certainly must acknowl-edge that one who can do these works is sent of God. His miracles were performed only when God could be glorified and establish His truths; they were not performed in order to gratify curiosity or for selfish purposes. There were many instances where the heal-ing power was not exercised even on the servants of the Lord, when they were sick, because it was not wise in the purposes of the Lord. The same rule applied to all the glits, and is an evidence of the the truth of Christi-anity. If the question be asked whether the message annonnced by Joseph the Prophet, was also con-timed by miracles, I answer, Yes; it was. The Apostle Orson Pratt says: "As we have already stated, the Lord, in His great mercy, has condescended to give miraculous evidence to estab-lish the divine authenticity of the Book of Mormon. It is useless forour enemies to say that there have been no miracles wrought confirmatory of the Book of Mormon, when there are tens of thoneands of people who can and do bear testimony as eye wit-heases to the contrary."
