EYE DOCTOR AND DETECTIVE.

ONE MAN COMBINED THE TWO TO SOME EXCELLENT PURPOSE.

He is an interesting account of a very clever but of detective work is a credit. It appears that in a large number, in which were employed several hundred persons, one of the workmen, in welding his hammer, care-

lessly allowed it to slip from his hand. It flew half way across the room and struck a fellow workman in the left eye. The man asserted that the sight was blinded by the blow, although a case of examination failed to reveal any injury, there not being a scratch on his eye. He thought it was the cause of a concussion for the two or half of his eyesight and advised all others to be careful.

Inder the law the owner of the factory was responsible for the injury resulting from the work of the men and although he believed that the man was shameless and that the whole case was a sham, he paid the man what he asked for his injury. He would be compelled to pay the claim.

The day of the first arrival, and it open court by counsel counsel retained by the defense exhibited the alleged injured man, and gave it as his opinion that it was as good as the injured eye. From the plaintiff's protest of his inability to see with his left eye, the court proved him a perjurer and awarded the man a judgment of \$1000.

A man who is supposed to be the injured man, is now in the hospital, and is recovering from his injuries.

Three people are also said to have been injured by the same accident.

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
