

THEATRE.—The Baron Seeman's entertainment at the Theatre is far ahead of anything of the kind ever exhibited in this city. Excited Animals.—Between seven and eight o'clock this morning a man was driving a load of colts on the upper part of Third East Street, when the front gate of his wagon gave way. The rocks rolled out striking the horses on the hind legs. The equines objecting to that kind of thing became excited and cut a number of excentric capers. Finally they broke loose from the wagon, left it in front of Col. Winder's house and dashed down the street with the tongue. Near Sharkey's corner the animals got reversed, the head of one being in relative position with the hind quarters of the other, and in this condition they went to the ground, where they were found by the breathless teamster. The result was a smashed wagon demolished harness and a flabby and tremulous team.

Serious Accident at Denver.—The Denver *News* of the 23rd says: "A serious accident happened on the Kansas Pacific Railroad last evening near the Twenty-Second Street crossing. A switch train had been made up to take passengers down to Jersey, two miles east of Denver, and soon after the train had started the engine jumped the track, breaking the headlight and back steps of the engine, and also breaking the four forward platforms of the baggage car and sleeper.

A man named Samuel Watkins, a stone mason employed on the Denver and Rio Grande, and another man named Pat Haley were standing on the platform between the sleeping car and the engine, having boarded the train just after it started. Watkins went down with the platform and was terribly bruised just below the abdomen.

Dr. Steele and four other physicians arrived on the spot as soon as possible after they were summoned, but found Watkins badly injured to save his life. He died a short time afterwards.
