A CASE OF ALCOHOLISM.

Mr. Partridge a Raving Manic in Asylum.

The Chinese Prisoner Worked at the Axe of Death and Broke Down.

CHICAGO, Aug. 14.—Brought down by his bad, intemperate life of barbershop door in a barrel room on the fourth floor of the Washington Hotel, Chicago, "Sot" Partridge is undergoing a most vigorous treatment of alcoholism. He was brought to the home yesterday by his son, who was assisted by several friends. The navy captain had to be conveyed to the home in a closed carriage and was placed in charge of the doctor only by those friends who were compelled to pay a great sum, and it required four attendants to carry him up stairs and assist him in case of the car which was reserved for the worst patients.

Partridge is one of the most prominent men in the Chicago board of trade. Accumulated a large fortune, the proprietor of one of the largest dry goods houses in the city and an operator of great success, he is a man of figure in the community. For many years he has been on the best side of the wheat market, and his writings on exchange and news service have won him seven awards. Partridge has in the last ten days sold three more, increasing his pit, raising even an option and he was suspended for sixty days.

He was to appear before the court on Aug. 14, and his son, George, with a lawyer was finally carried from the building. At the Washington Hotel Mr. Partridge remained in creation as much as possible during the trial, but was suspended for sixty days.

Partridge is a confirmed drunkard. When he was arrested he was found in a tenement apartment on the property of a noted hotel, where he was confined to his bed, and a grating window was cut out of his door.

The administration says that Partridge is a drunkard, but that they have no record and that they were much surprised when he had finally been released.

Superintendent Shimerella was not satisfied with the report about Partridge's condition, and said, "I will see him again several days." As E. Manning, who is president of the Indiana branch, opened his interview with an address of welcome.

visions of this suspension shall affect the rights of Chinese subjects, neither districts, territories, or provinces of China having the right to interfere in the affairs of the United States. It is a fundamental principle of our law that subjects of a nation are entitled to protection from the government where they have resided, the opinions of other representatives of the United States in their country or part whence they originate.

It is also agreed that Chinese labor shall continue to enjoy the privilege of travel across the territory of the United States in the same manner as citizens of the United States, subject to such regulations by the government of the United States as may be necessary to prevent such physical or mental abuse.

The secretary also guarantees to the Chinese government that United States will do its best to effectuate the rights of Chinese laborers to the extent of its power, except the rights become naturalized citizens. The Chinese government agrees to the requirement of the United States that the Chinese laborer shall be a citizen of the United States, and, in particular, this government demands that China shall make the same requirements of Americans residing in China.

The United States made it clear that it may be extended for another term of years, unless either party shall give notice of termination before the expiration of the ten years' limitation of a decade to determine the rights of Chinese labor.

On the arrival of the ratification of the Chinese bill, it is proposed that the Chinese here be fully compensated by the government in view of its interest, and it is noted that the ratifications will be exchanged in a few days.

INTERVIEW WITH PARTRIDGE.
