The State board of education will meet today as was intended, the meeting having been postponed until Monday morning at 10 o'clock.

The Belfast News-Letter of April 4, reports a gift of £31 4s 2d from Dr. D. Moore Lindsay, of Salt Lake City, to the Lady O'Neill fund for the widows and orphans of British soldiers.

Morris Lewis and Louis Edgar, two young Salt Lakers who run away from their homes the other day, were found in Ogden and taken into custody. News of their apprehension was sent to the parents of the boys.

County Treasurer Lynch says there are a few more property owners who have not complied with the statute on taxes as yet. Such ones the treasurer says will be brought to feel the hand of the law.

Leon Stringfellow, Harry Wright and Bill Ross, three boys from the south, are here. They are accused of throwing stones at Jacob Appleman and seriously injuring him. They will be arraigned before Justice Nielsen, on the charge of battery.

S. O. Day was to have addressed the Utah Poultry Association at its meeting last evening, but through misfortune it was not present. The lecture was therefore postponed. After attending to a few business matters the meeting adjourned.

JAMES E. MURPHY, an employee of the Taylorville and Murray Creamery Company, is summoned to appear before Justice McDonald on a charge of embezzlement. The information says that Murphy appropriated to his own use \$1 belonging to the company.
