CONGRESSIONAL.

SENATE.

The P. D. and S. L. Railroad, &c.

WASHINGTON, 12.—In the Senate

today, Mr. Kelly, of Oregon,

gave notice that after the P. O.

bills should be disposed of, he would

ask the Senate to consider the bill

to provide for the construction of

the Portland, Calles and Salt Lake

Railroad and Telegraph Line; Ed-

munds, of Vt., gave notice that he

would object to it. (Laughter.)

The Senate passed the House

bill to authorize the Secretary of

War to ascertain the amount of

expense incurred by the States of

Oregon and California in suppress-

ing Indian hostilities in 1872-73.

Morrill, of Vt., from the commit-

tee on public buildings and grounds,

reported favorably on the bill for

the construction of a custom house

and bonded warehouse at Port-

land, Oregon; placed on the calen-

dar.
