"The horrible crimes of the corpora-tions have come to be understood by the people. The people realize that great utilities are not being operated for the public welfare, but for the ag-grandizement of one man, which is the reverse of public sentiment and public demand.

"Corporations have taken private property, which can only be taken pos-session of upon the assumption that certain rights are to revert to the own-ers of that property, when in fact they are providing no return to the people. "We have recently had explained to us how a certain man or certain interest can carry freight from one section of the country to another for one-half

of the country to another for one-half of what other men have to pay. Sup-pose a man with 100 head of cattle had been allowed to pass through a tollgate by paying one-half of what his neigh-bor had to pay. What do you suppose the people at that time would have done? Why, they would have torn down the tollgate, and ultimately we will tear down the railroads, destroy them, peaceably if we can, forcibly if we must."
