Reports that have circulated in the city freely for a year or two, connect-ing the National City Bank with under-taking the formation of a huge bank-ing corporation of vast capital, were fully confirmed yesterday in the an-nouncement that the directors of the

institution had unanimously voted to recommend to the shareholders an in-crease of its capital stock from \$1,000,000 to \$10,000,000. This capitalization is larger by 100 per cent than that of any other bank in the country, and the president of the institution, James Stillman, figures out that with the new cap-italization the bank will afford its depositors security of \$25,000,000. No doubt exists of the approval

the directors' action by the bank's shareholders. The formal meeting to ratify the increase of capital will not be held until January 2, but it is known that the control of the bank is veseted in the hands of a few. These persons, largely represented by the directors, approve the measure and stand ready to subscribe to the necessary amount of stock, including the proportion to which present holders are entitled under the new capitalization, should any such dissent from the plan.

VALUE OF THE STOCK.

The price and terms on which the new stock will be offered was not stat-ed yesterday. At present, with a cap-ital of \$1,000,000 and surplus and undivided profits of \$4,818,500, the stock has

a book value of \$582 per share, and is selling at \$2,077. With the same sur-plus and profits, with a capitalization of \$10,000,000, the book figures out about \$148 per share.
