terminated by Ravages of Disease. Washington. April 2.-Dr. S. Harris, professor of medicine in the University of Alabama, at Mobile, taiked to the prosident today about the ravages of con-sumption among the negroes of the south. He expressed the fear-and he added that his opinion was concurred in by the med-ical fratervity generally in the south-that the negro race was likely to become extinct in this country through the rav-ages of disease, especially consumption. Statistics showed, he declared, that the death rate among the members of the negro race in America was greater than the birth rate.
