JUDGE ROLAPP RE-NOMINATED.

Strong Speech of Acceptance—Nomination Meets With Popular Approval.

SCHOOL TEACHERS ASSIGNED.

City and County Appointments for 1904-5—Opera House Leased for 5 Years—Wedding Bells.

The Democratic judicial convention of the second judicial district, which comprises Weber, Davis and Morgan counties, met in the county court house yesterday afternoon at 3:15 o'clock for the purpose of nominating candidates for district judge and district attorney.

The meeting was called to order by Thomas D. Dee, and James H. Wilcox, Davis county, was named as temporary chairman, and William Robinson, temporary secretary. The temporary officers were made permanent.

The first nomination called for was district judge. A. G. Horn, in a forcible speech, placed in nomination the name of Hon. H. H. Rolapp, the present incumbent of the position, and his name was received with round applause, and on motion of Attorney Greer the rules were suspended and his nomination was made by acclamation.

Judge Rolapp was called for and received a hearty ovation. He was greeted with enthusiasm. In a very eloquent and earnest speech he thanked the delegates for the honor bestowed upon him. Part of his address follows:

"Nine years ago, when, at the invitation of the Democratic party, the people of this district chose me as their judge I silently vowed that so far as lay in my power the confidence then placed in me should not be abused. I felt as I would so act that whatever my fellow citizens should demand the return of the judicial mantle which they had so generously entrusted to me, I should be able to lay it at their feet as stainless as I had received it. Whether I have lived up to that vow or not is for you to say. I admit frankly and confess that my judgment has not always been faultless; that my actions have not always been either wise or just. But before the gentlemen of this convention, and before Almighty God, my heart and my conscience is satisfied that under no circumstances has my conduct been such as to bring upon me the least factor in the determination of judicial matters coming before this court. And rich and poor, low and high, Republican or Democrat, have remained on an equal before the bar of justice in this district. And when I make this statement I do not think that I am expressing egotism or self-justification, because I recognize as the duty of right conscience ought to exist wherever the God of Justice presides over the controversies among American citizens. I am only making this statement to assure you that if I shall be honored with re-election I shall continue along the same lines that I have followed in the past, and I say it for the further purpose of giving notice here and now that so long as I sit upon the bench, or so long as I am engaged for judicial honors, I cannot and will not be a partisan or take part in political controversies or in fact enter the political arena at all; and I feel certain that you will not construe me for that cause."
