**BLAINE'S REPLY TO HARRISON.**

**Communication Between the President**  
and the Secretary.

**Washington, April 8.—**President Harrison has written to Secretary Blaine, informing him of his meeting with the latter.

It is learned that the conference was upon the physiology of the Fertilization Appropriation Bill, and its relation to Institute districts.

The entire correspondence in the matter has been handled solely by Blaine; it is understood that the question of treaty obligations will be considered at a later date.

It is necessary to have set forth in a reply an interpretation of the treaty, which will stand.

President Harrison will be awaiting a prompt and frank coming reply, to appear in such language that the meaning cannot be disputed.

**THE MINERS' CONVENTION.**  
Called to a Session and Information-  
out.

**Pueblo, April 8.—**The Intemational Conference of miners and operators came to an adjournment and adjourned this evening after a brief battle of words and opinion, after further talk on the subject of the miners' strike.

It is understood that the miners' strike is practically over, that the interim agreement has been abolished and the miners' most strenuous resolutions that were passed at the convention last fall for the past five years are being set off and may not be rescinded.

Doyle said, "It appears from the information given to me that the miners' strike is entirely without the consent of the miners of Colorado." He said he had consulted with representative labor leaders in all sections, and has been assured that the miners' strike is destined finally and in other ways than the threatened strike occurs.

**American Settlements.**

**New York, April 8.—**A mass meeting of the members of the Central Labor Union to take action on the stand of the manufacturing classes of Rochester, tonight, several thousand spectators were present.

Resolutions were adopted, bitterly denouncing the state Board of Arbitration and calling on the manufacturers to remove its members.

**Interesting Papers of the Patent Commission.**
