The June Term Convived in This City Today.

THE OPINIONS HANDED DOWN.

Setting of Cases for the Term—Attorneys Admitted to Practice at the Bar.

The June Term of the Supreme Court of Utah Territory commenced in this city this afternoon.

It was 12 o'clock when Chief Justice Morris, Associate Justices Warren, Smith and King, filed into court.

One motion of Judge Powers, Attorney of New York, was admitted to practice at the bar of the Supreme Court of this Territory.

On motion of J. W. Judd, Attorney of Texas, was admitted to practice at the bar of the Supreme Court.

Opinions were then handed down as follows:

In the case of Thomas Curtis vs. Park City, the judgment of the court affirmed and the judgment of the lower court was reversed. Delivered by Judge King; Justice Morris and Associate Justice Smith concurring.

In the case of Wm. H. McMurphy, plaintiff and respondent, vs. Henry Smith, defendant and appellant, the case was decided during the last term, 1860, the chief justice and Associate Justice Smith concurring in the judgment of reversal. Judgment of this court, however, rendered in error.

The Ford case is not the only one of marked interest to many, however. Tonight, also, the charges against Chief Downing—said to be twenty-five in number—are due from the members of the committee. The chief is accused of having been guilty of several illegal acts, and it is to be seen whether he can be exonerated.

He knows, he says, that he did do nothing that over the most serious charge can have a case upon. It has been intimated that unless the charges are more substantial than they are, and they are, he will pay little or no attention to them.
