OCCASIONS MUCH COMMENT.

New York, arch 20 .- An operation involving the transfusion of blood into the veins of a child 5 days old, performed by Dr. Alexis Carroll, head of the Rockefeller institute, has created wide attention among physicians and surgeons. The child was suffering from urpura, a little known disease, one of whose symptoms is a weakening of the valls of the arteries so that the blood wails of the arteries so that the body, secapes from all parts of the body. When Dr. Carroll was called into the case he gave it as his opinion that the transfusion of blood offered the only hope of saying the tiny patient. The anastusion of blood offered the only nope of saying the liny patient. The child's father, Dr. Adrian V. S. Lam-bert, volunteered to give all of his own blood that was necessary and one of his arteries was connected with the odby's blood vessels. The effect was timost instantaneously beneficial and he little one is now not only out of all langer, but rapidly gaining flesh. This is said to be the first case on record in which so young a patient has been pacessfully freated for purpura by this method—the only method known by which it can be combatted and to em-ploy which in the case of a tiny infant was commented upon by members of he medical profession yesterday as an edical profession yesterday as an ionally daring feat.
