THE CZAR AT CORFU.

Measures for His Safety While Remaining on the Island.

STRANGERS CAREFULLY WATCHED.

CORFU, Oct. 16.—The Greek government and local authorities of Corfu are taking measures for the safety of Czar. Police successfully watching all strangers to Corfu, and all arrivals at the port to give a good account of themselves.

The arrival of the King of Greece being placed in thorough order for the use of the czar.

The number of officials have been increased, and more police and sailors are assigned. The police patrols will include the ports of the shores of the whole island to prevent the landing of unauthorised strangers.
