OHIO COPPER.

Mascotte Tunnel Finished to Distance Of Over 12,250 Feet.

Of Over 12,250 Feet. Out at the Ohlo Copper properties in Bingham, development work is being pushed as rapidly as possible. Con-trary to general belief, there has been no let-up in the driving of the Mas-cotte tunnel, which recently encoun-tered a large flow of water. In explanation of this, Manager Co-lin McIntosh has scated to the "News" representative that while it was thought for a time it would be neces-sary to let up for a few days in or-der to give the territory pene-trated sufficient time in which to become drained it was found, upon closer examination, that the water was not coming forth in such volume as to seriously interfere with operations. Consequently, the avenue has been pushed steadily ahead and is now in a distance of a little more than 12,250 distance of a little more than 12,250

feet. Mr. McIntosh says it will take less than 560 feet of driving to carry the face of the tunnel to a point under the main working shaft with which connection is to be made. At the rate the work in the tunnel is now pro-gressing it will not be many weeks until the Mascotte tunnel will have reached the objective point. In the meantime, the new mill build-ing is being completed and if ordinary energy is displayed, the equipment should be in place and the plant ready for commission within the next ninety days.
