

IN THE REICHSTAG.

Dr. Netherling Introduces His Anti-Revolutionary Bill.

SOCIALISTS INTERRUPT HIM.

Debate on the Measure Adjourned Till Next Month.—The Reichstag.

Reichstag, Dec. 17.—Dr. Netherling, imperial secretary of justice, introduced his anti-revolutionary bill in the Reichstag today. He said it was not intended to spend public money, nor was it a disguised anti-socialist law, but it was directed against the socialists who were frequent and against the work of revolutionists seeking to undermine the state.

The secretary of justice then proceeded to read several inflammatory pamphlets which recently had appeared. The introductions of the socialists were frequent and against the work of revolutionists seeking to undermine the state.

Dr. Netherling moved to adjourn the Reichstag, expressing doubts whether a sufficient number of deputies were present to enable a vote to be taken. After roll call it was found that 180 deputies were present.
