Michigan Claimed for Cleveland.

Sr. Louis, Mo., 9.—Secretary of State McGrath, in reply to an inquiry from an Associated Press reporter, says: "In this State the official re-turns are not opened and counted un-til all the counties are in; but I have special returns from 60 counties and St. Louis City, and from these and a computation of votes of 46 counties not heard from, I conclude that the Cleveland electors will have from seventeen to twenty thousand major-ity over the fusion electors, that Mar-maduke's plurality for Governor will be about 12,500, and his majority not more than 5,000. Parooks, prohibition, for Governor, will have eight to ten thousand votes. The State Senate will probably stand 25 democrats, nine op-position.
