diemen. The national association in its esti-mate places the number of sheep fit for shearing in the United States at 42,283,-205, an increase of 1,981,657 over the preceding year. The wool season of 1909 witnessed a full recovery in prices and volume of business from the finan-cial panic of 1907-08. The total wool production of the United States this year is estimated at 228,110,749 pounds, an increase of 6,863,-137 pounds over last year. The total value of the wool clip of 1909, as esti-mated on the price in Boston, is \$88,-\$29,746, as compared with \$81,707,516 for 1908. Total imports of foreign wool for 1909 were 226,409,304 pounds, as com-pared with 123,980,524 pounds for the year preceding. The estimated wool production of the world, according to the latest official estimate, is 2,804,136,546 pounds, an in-crease in 14 years of only 111,149,773 pounds. The wool product is not keep-ing pace with the wool-using popula-tion, for the per capita product in 1895 was 4.88 pounds, while now it is 4.27 pounds.
