Tacoma, Wash., Jan. 15.—A railroad building race involving the expenditure of \$10,000,000 has been commenced by two wealthy corporations, each of which desires to own the first railroad to the Yukon country. This road will be about 400 miles long, running from Fairbank, Alaska, to the mouth of the Yukon, via the coast.

Both corporations have secured rights of way from the federal government, and are now working to secure from Congress necessary rights of way through the Yukon region.
