**Last Night's Dispatches.**  
**CONGRESSIONAL.**  
**SENATE.**  
**Bill Referred.**  
WASHINGTON, 17.—Bills were in-  
troduced and referred as follows:  
By Kelly, from the committee on  
amendments, the Senate bill to extend  
the term of the Northern Pacific Railroad.  
He asked that the amendments be recom-  
mended, and it was so ordered.  
Hendricks presented a petition of  
citizens of Massachusetts, asking  
the passage of a law making every  
member of Congress directly respon-  
sible to the electors of his dis-  
trict, the majority of whom, if he  
does not meet their expectations or  
justify their confidence, may, at  
any time, recall him and appoint a  
successor.  
Sherman submitted a concurrent  
resolution, proposing a common  
unit of money and accounts for the  
U. S. and Great Britain. The resolu-  
tion requests the President to pro-  
pose a treaty convention between  
the two countries, the money of ac-  
count in both of them; it is to be  
represented by a coin formed of  
standard gold 40 pure metal and  
140 copper, or copper and silver  
alloy. Five of these new dollars  
are to be the equivalent of one  
pound sterling. Gold coins of va-  
rious denominations, conforming to  
this standard, are to be issued and  
to be legal tender within each  
country.  
Booth introduced a bill in relation  
to lands heretofore granted railroad  
companies. It provides that all  
such lands, except the 200,000 acres  
portion of a road accepted by the  
government as completed shall be  
subject to local taxation, and re-  
quires the commission to the  
general land office to prepare and  
deliver, without delay, patents for  
all lands thus earned if free from  
conflicting claims and clearly with-  
in the limits of the grant. If the  
cost of survey, etc., are not paid by  
the railroad company they may be  
sold by the general land office, and  
the proceeds paid to the railroad com-  
pany at the sale of such lands shall  
constitute a lien upon the patent,  
which shall then be issued to the  
company. The bill also requires  
the general land office to sell any  
land not disposed of within  
three years after the completion  
of any road to the first bidder, in  
compliance with the terms of  
the pre-emption laws.  
Sargent introduced a bill to  
amend the act to provide for the  
coinage of silver, and to alter the  
legal tender, at its nominal  
value, for amounts not exceeding  
twenty dollars in any one transac-  
tion. It also provides for the coinage  
of silver half dollars legal tender  
for amounts up to ten dollars.  
Hamilton called up the resolution  
of Edmunds, reported by the  
committee on rules, which provides  
that the joint rules of Congress  
shall be the joint rules of the  
government of the two houses  
during the present session. The  
question being on the amendment  
of Edmunds, to extend the 24th rule,  
in relation to counting the votes  
for the President and Vice-  
President, until the expiration of the  
hour having expired, the Chair  
announced that the resolution would  
be laid over.  
Boutwell said the officers of the  
Treasury Department were prepar-  
ing a statement in answer to the  
points made by the Senator from  
Virginia (Davis) in his speech  
last, and it would not be ready for  
the use of the Senate until to-mor-  
row.  
The Senate then resumed the  
consideration of the resolution in  
regard to the joint rules; after de-  
bating the Senate without action  
upon the resolution, went into a  
special session, and the House  
session, and soon after adjourned.

The new rule was adopted, yeas  
156, nays 102, nearly a party vote.  
The remarks by Haddenburgh  
in favor of the bill, the committee  
rose without action.  
Morrison offered a resolution,  
calling on the President for copies  
of all correspondence with Spain  
in reference to the island of Cuba;  
adopted.  
Wood offered a resolution in-  
structing the committee on ways  
and means to inquire whether the  
lease of the U. S. to the Alaska  
Commercial Company, of the right  
to take for seals in Alaska, made  
and executed in pursuance of  
law, was to the best advantage of  
the U. S.; whether the interest  
of the U. S. has been properly  
protected, and whether the Alaska  
Commercial Company has com-  
plied with its terms and conditions;  
adopted.  
Wood offered a resolution in-  
structing the committee on mili-  
tary affairs to inquire whether,  
since the close of the rebellion, any  
army officer on the active list has  
held or exercised the functions of a  
civil officer, either in the diplo-  
matic or consular service, or has  
carried on any negotiations or arrange-  
ments with any foreign govern-  
ment, or with any individual, in  
violation of the laws of the United  
States; and whether the President  
has performed any civil duties in or about  
the executive office under such au-  
thority, and whether legislation is nec-  
essary to prevent such assignments;  
adopted.  
Hendricks introduced a bill for the  
printing of the speeches delivered  
in Congress in the language in  
which they are delivered; referred.  
New introduced a constitutional  
amendment to limit the Presi-  
dential term to four years; referred.  
The House adjourned at 4:30.
