Report from Tree Inspector W. H. Cole as to Spraying, etc.

RESULTS OF THE SEASON'S WORK.

A POLLUTED STREAM.

Inspector of Provisions McAllister wrote stating that application had been made to the health department of this city for permission to fill the ten ponds near the big ditch which contains water from Big Cottonwood canyon.Leave has been withheld, however, owing to the fact that the stream was polluted by the refuse from slaughter-houses, livery pens, barns, etc., located on or adjacent thereto. The same might be said of the majority of the streams in the county, which render the water unfit for public or military purposes.

AN INTERESTING REPORT.

W. N. Cole submitted his first annual report as tree inspector for Salt Lake county. He states that a large majority of the fruit growers had of the work of spraying with a determination to get rid of the insects that infest the trees. Now, if it is assumed that they must, and that they did just as little as possible so as to comply with the law. The work this season had been done under a great many disadvantages, and did not prove as effective as could have been desired. The sprays used were not strong enough to kill the insects in question, as they did just in the spraying season, rendered much of the spraying useless by washing the poison from fruit and leaves.

In further season the work had been done under more favorable conditions of the codling moth, and the sprays of no less amount were upon use in large numbers. The pest leaf blaster and the pear and cherry leaf blight were doing tremendous damage to the orchards, and the sprays white woolly aphid, green spider, red spider and other various insects were driving the life right out of trees and plants, while several different species of birds were found feeding upon the insects. The pest leaf blaster and the tender twigs of our orchards were vineyards. All of these could be overcome by the proper remedies applied at the right time. For our fruit growers to get out the best results next year it would be necessary to do a real amount of work with the trees now in a dormant condition. A large number of the pests named could be more successfully controlled with the use of various fogs, because many insects washed could be used without danger of any injury resulting to the trees.

So far as we could learn, about 10 per cent of the work required for the control of the various insect diseases condition. In some of our orchards winter sprays, when the work of spraying was well done, it is estimated that 80 per cent of the crop would be saved, and about 20 per cent of good fruit.

All circumstances considered, the universal verdict was that the new law, such as it is, had served a grand success in its second season's work and added to the general interest of thousands of dollars over and above the cost of operation. So far as we could learn, had been no injurious results to gardens or stock in consequence of the new law.

The statement that the Legislature gives considerable attention to the interests of agriculture, and that the public would not otherwise generally obtain, and to this end one county board had passed a resolution to the effect that the session had been organized and was now in good working condition.
