TEXT OF THE MESSAGE.

To the Senate and the House of Rep-

resentatives. I hive asked for a joint session of the senate and the house of represen-tatives at this time for the purpose of bringing to your attention, my special message, a matter of very great im-portance to the present mode of the state, and a consideration of even greater importance to the ruture wel-mer of the state. There is no act that will more sig-mally characterize the eighth legitla-tive assembly than the passage of such messares as will meare the commence-
