Before the vote on the Utah bill Cannon claimed that the bill was special in its provisions. If there was any reason for it, that reason also applied to all the Territories. He declared that the bill was in the interest of a ring of speculators, and that the U.S. marshal and district attorney had been here lobbying for it, and that the latter claimed that he drew up the bill.

Poland said that if he did claim it, it was untrue, he, Poland, had been assisted in the preparation of the bill only by Whitney, a lawyer of Salt Lake. Poland closed the debate by saying that the Mormons were as hostile to the government as any portion of the people of the South were during the darkest hour of the rebellion, that the law against polygamy, passed twelve years ago, had been boldly and unblushingly disobeyed, and he declared that Congress ought either to repeal the law, or take means, such as this bill afforded. for its enforcement.
