cotton cushion or maple scale has read-ily been subjugated wherever sprayed with kerosene emulsion double strength. with kerosene emulsion double strength. I took a sample at random from Mr. Hogle's trees a week after they had been sprayed and I sent them to Cali-fornia for microscopical examination and got the return that every insect was killed on the sample branch sent. You may ask why I don't send sam-ples to our Agricultural college. I will answer, because I soldow get an answer to any samples sent or any inquiries made, so I have about given up hoping to hear anything from them. The fruit crop is very scant this year in Sait Lake county, purtly on account of great injury by simelier smoke and partly from other causes. I have personally done some inspection from house to house, but most of my time has been occupied in answering calls, and es-
