HOW RECEIVED IN EUROPE.

New York, April 4 .- The strenuou note of President Roosevelt's Chicag-speech rises above the tumult of th Balkans and court functions at Lisbon and Copenhagen, cables the Tribune's London correspondent. The speech is reported fully in the general press dispatches and commented upon favorably as an authoritative exposition of the policy of the United States government The closeness and impartiality with which the president balances the good faith of the British and German governments in the Venezuelan affair causs disappointment among those anxious to secure preferential treatment in fa to secure preferential treatment in la-vor of England, but the passages deal-ing with the inter-oceanic canal and the development of American naval power are welcomed as proofs that buncombe has gene out of favor and that action has taken the place of vague blustering. The altruism of the president's speech is not understood in the certical of an empire which has been president's speech is not underscool in the capital of an empire which has been built up on the principle of enlightened self interest. The objection is raised by some writers that the trouble will arise whenever an European power finds itself powerless to obtain redress in Spanish America, unless by the seizure of territory, and the "little England" controversalists are puzzled by the demand for a stronger navy when the Monroe doctrine has been sanctioned by Great Britain and Ger many. This as a whole, greatly in-creases the president's prestige abroad, and it was already unique.
