Washington, Nov. 8 .- President Roosevelt today informed a delegation of residents of Oklahoma that he would recommend in his forthcoming message to Congress single statehood for Oklahoma and Indian Territory. The delegation consisted of Delegate Maguire, chairman; Charles H. Wilson of the Republican territorial committee; C. M.

Republican Ferritorial committee, C. M. Cade, Republican National committee-man, and Vernon W. Whiting. They told the president they hoped Congress would pass a single statehood meas-ure in accordance with his recommen-He discussed briefly the question of

incorporating in the statehood meas-ure a stipulation for prohibition of the liquor traffic, urging that the question be left to the determination of the people, as, with their personal knowledge of the needs of the Indians in the ter-

of the needs of the finding in the ter-ritory, they would settle the question properly. The members of the delegation dis-cussed with the president the appoint-ment of a governor of the territory, recommending Capt. Frank Frantz, whose appointment subsequently was announced.
