WEST INDIES.
St. Thomas, W. I., 20.—An ex-
pedition was successfully landed in
Cuba by the *Orizaba*, and *La Cabaña*,
at the same time that General *Arce*,
quellera landed from Jamaica, the
Ottawa landed two batteries, 1,500
men and arms and 500,000 cartridges.
A party of forty men, and officers
had the munitions in charge, and
were received by Cuban forces.
