## HEARINGS IN THE DISTRICT COURT.

Ponderous Record in the Hammer vs Howell Appeal Case—Kiser Convicted of Burglary.

### PROF. T. E. M'KAY BANQUETED

County School Property Transfers—More Holdings—Horse Steals—News Briefs.

Ogden, Utah, Sept. 14.—Late yesterday afternoon the case of the State against C. M. Kiser, accused of burglarizing the hardware store of the George A. Lowe company, was completed and submitted to the jury, who, after a few minutes' deliberation, returned into court with a unanimous verdict of guilty of burglary in the first degree as charged. Sentence will be passed on him Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock by Judge Howell. Frank Schmidt, the man who gave such damaging testimony Tuesday against Kiser, was recalled yesterday morning to cross-examine him, but he had evidently told a straight story of Kiser's admissions to him of his guilt and he could not be changed.

The defendant took the witness stand in his own behalf, and denied the charge of having knowledge of the same. He claimed that he bought some of the razors found in his possession, and the others which had been identified as part of the stolen goods, he claimed were given to him by two men for whom he was selling the stolen razors and knives.

### PONDEROUS COURT RECORD.

Judge Morse Setting Bill of Exceptions In Judship Contest Case.

In the hearing of the appeal of the case of Daniel Hammer against J. Albert Howell, commonly known as the second district judgeship contest, the supreme court will have submitted to it the most momentous bill of exceptions ever presented before the court. Judge Charles W. Morse was in Ogden last night engaged in settling the bill of exceptions for the record in that case.

No motion of the attorneys for the contestants, Judge Howell, has been permitted to go forward, so the bill, permitting all the ballots which were submitted in the case should be attached to the record and go before the supreme court for consideration and review. These include all the ballots cast in the absent cases in the second judicial district, comprising Weber, Davis and Morgan counties. Judge Morse directed the sheriff of Weber county to bring the ballots of Morgan and Davis counties to the county clerk of Weber and directed the clerk to attach them to the record in the case. The transcript was already in regular order and with these exhibits added it will probably require a good sized van to carry the record to the court.

### X-RAYS CURES CANCER.

At the meeting of the Utah County Medical society held yesterday an interesting case was shown. The cancerous epithelioma was presented by George E. Robinson. The patient, Martin Ivie of Seville was present and was examined by the doctors. About three years ago the cancerous growth began on Mr. Ivie's lower lip, and was treated by a number of persons without success. It had spread rapidly, and above the chin and was very painful if not removed by an operation. Mr. Ivie came to the Provo general hospital the latter part of August, and the X-ray treatment was given. After the first treatment it was removed, and after the third application the cancerous substance disappeared.

The sixth treatment was given yesterday and the whole affected area was nearly covered with a healthy growth of skin and the expectation is that Mr. Ivie will be entirely cured in about a week.
