"THE LAW OF DESPOTISM AND TYRANNY."

In reference to the proposed un-American and revolutionary legislation for Utah the Omaha Herald a short time ago had an editorial from which we take the following:

The destruction of self-government and the right of trial by jury in Utah through executive commissions and star-chamber trials, backed by the regular soldiery, will not destroy polygamy. The experiment, if pushed to this kind of extreme, will recoil on its inventors. Bayonets are not the proper weapons with which to destroy social evils in a free country. This is a land of law.

Law is not law that tramples down every principle of personal right under the heel of a military despotism. That kind of law is the law of might. It is the law of despotism and tyranny. Utah contains 150,000 peaceable and industrious people who are, in vast majority, as honest in their religious belief and in their lives as any other people on the face of the earth. Fanatical they must be, ignorant to a great extent they may be, deluded they are. But bad as is polygamy in the estimation of universal Christendom, and much as its existence in Utah is to be deplored, the proposed remedy for it may be worse than the disease if these extreme measures are to be forced upon a people who will be found very much in earnest in defence of what they hold to be their rights and privileges when these measures come to be enforced upon the leaders and teachers of that people by the arbitrary means that are being devised for the purpose.

Democrats cannot defend a people whose position is indefensible, but they can, and they will, protest against the establishment of a military despotism in Utah upon the ruins of those personal rights and liberties which are the birthright of every American.
