The Forenoon Session Lasted About Thirty Minutes.

THE COPPER PLANT ONCE MORE.

Fines of Not Guilty—Tens for At-Risk—Guilty—Cases Set for Trial.

A very short session was held in the Salt Lake City court this morning, the time consumed being only about thirty minutes. Judge Merritt occupied the bench. Among the other business transacted was an order for the sale of the copper plant, consisting of about 200 tons of copper ore at the Coppermine Mine at Marmat, Utah. The order was made on the petition of the owners, C. P. Mason. The only other order for the purchase of the dump was by H. G. Wilson, who agreed to pay 20 cents per ton for all ore taken from the dump and delivered at the mill or smelter, the weights on the cars from the mill or smelter to be the basis on which to compute the amount to be paid. The reason for the new order is that the ore is of low grade and expensive to treat. The order of sale was made by Judge Merritt and carried out by the attorney's committee with the case. This is one of the reasons of the "Copper Plant." Whence striking economy since the plant has been sold were rendered unavoidable in the recent regions of North Salt Lake, and where came near swamping the public of the people's money in the city. Judge Smith Deals Out Justice to Two Laroseists.

The case of Wm. Magrave charged with the larceny of Real Estate Broker J. W. Hamm's overcoat from the First Street, putting place on election day, was up in the police court this afternoon. Several witnesses were sworn and examined but no evidence, other than that Magrave was in possession of the coat, was found. The defendant was found guilty of larceny and fine \$50 and costs.

A. C. Rupp, who was yesterday found guilty of stealing Contractor contractor's money, was stricken for sentence. The defendant pleaded for mercy to the court, stating that his wife and family were poor in Oregon, were destitute and unable to support him. The defendant pleaded guilty over a year ago to the same offense and was fined \$50, which was paid by a friend of his. Although he stated that he was innocent of the

charge at this time, the court imposed a fine of \$50 and ordered him jailed for thirty days in addition thereto.

John Gayle and Clarence McCollough, who were arrested by Officer Hamm for vagrancy, stated that they were quiet, respectable men who were en route to Park City in quest of work. They were discharged.

James Russell was fined \$5 for overrunning his bill. Andrew Lundgren, who got drunk for the first time this year, was discharged.

SLAYERS OF SHERIFF BURNS.

Reverend and Mrs. the Notaries Outlaws Said to Be Hiding in This City.

The somewhat startling news was given out at the police station today by Clerk James and others that Ratliff and Michel, the notorious outlaws and murderers of Sheriff Burns of Sanpete county, were in hiding in this city and that they had been positively identified by a man who knows both of them.

The statement may and may not be true. No many exands have circulated as to the whereabouts of these fugitives from justice that the authorities are beginning to take them with the traditional dose of salt water and gunpowder. The officers are not unmindful of their duty, however, and continue to keep a sharp eye on the streets. The officials are conducting a full investigation and the conservative estimate is that all of the fugitives will be captured by the end of the month.

When officers received information to the effect that otherwise the outlaws were here, their photographs were posted in a conspicuous place in the regular room over the office of the Register and Tribune so that all citizens might familiarize themselves with the faces and refer to the station accordingly. The officers are on a vigorous hunt for big game which they would give their old home to bag.

The chief line runs to Pretoria, and even to Cape Town, a distance of over 100 miles. The drivers have a hard, eventful life.

Kaffir girls do the riding and drives team teams. Horses are used in the town for effect, but crossing the road they will drive anything that will quit. The other day a box containing a number of live chickens was sent to the docks across the river, but nothing happened to them. Horses are wonderful with a tariff of \$1 a week and up to board and wages.
