On the road between the mouth of Baker's Kanyon and the summit of Cove Creek hill, in Millard Co., under the direc-tion of Thos. Callister, \$500.

- On the road running north of Heber city, to intersect the Wasatch road at Kimball's

hotel, in Summit Co., \$500, Said committee on Roads also reported in relation to the extension of the Sait Lake City and Wanship wagon road easterly over the Weber river, that said extension could not be made without an amendment to the charter and an arrangement with the proprietor for the value of the present bridges. The committee reported a proposition from the proprietor of the Weber bridge. Said report and proposition were laid on the table till Wednesday next.

The committee on Petitions and Memo-rials, to whom was referred a memorial to Congress for a re-survey of the public lands, reported back the same with amend-

ment and recommended its adoption. Said memorial was read and adopted.
