WEBER COUNTY AFFAIRS.

Marion Sken Appointed Water Commissioner for the County.

Old Folks Excursion to Salt Lake—Court Notes—Candidates for Matrimony—Return from California.

Marion Sken was appointed by the board of county commissioners as county water commissioner, in accordance with the recent act of the State legislature. The other candidates were H. D. Peterson and F. W. Stratford.

L. B. Adams was selected by the board as delegate to the Transmississippi commercial congress which meets in Chippie Creek, Colorado, July 16-19, 1901, to represent Weber county.

A communication was received from the Deseret agricultural and manufacturing society asking that the county commissioners use their efforts to have Weber county well exhibited at the state fair to be held in Salt Lake City in October. The secretary was notified that representatives of the fair may meet with the commissioners July 10 at 3 p. m. to discuss matters pertaining thereto.

County Attorney Halverson reported that the plaintiff in the case of J. A. Wright vs. Joseph Stanford has taken an appeal to the Supreme court from Judge Rolapp's decision. The county attorney was authorized to issue a writ of habeas corpus to the plaintiff.

The board was authorized to issue a warrant in the sum of \$102 to pay for another sprinkling wagon to be used by the county.

DRY FARM GRAIN IS SUFFERING.

Would Be Greatly Benefited by a Good Rain.

FIRST LUCERN CROP CUT.

Irrigated Crops Thriving—New Potatoes Being Marketed—Remarks of Correspondents.

U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Utah section, climate and crop service, weather bureau. Weekly crop bulletin, Salt Lake City, Utah, June 25, 1901. The week ended June 24th was clear, dry and warm. Beneficial showers in the vicinity of Helper, Carbon County, on the 20th, but this is the only rainfall reported. The average excess of temperature was about six degrees. Dry farm grain is again suffering from drought and will be greatly benefited by a good rain. Irrigated crops made good growth. Wheat, oats and sugar beets continue in good condition. The first crop of lucern is nearly all stored and generally in good condition. New potatoes are ready for use in a few localities.

REMARKS OF CROP CORRESPONDENTS.

(The name of the post office is followed by the name of the county.)

Snowville, Boxelder.—Much warmer. Lucern is in bloom; the yield will be below the average. Everything is growing nicely. Feed on the ranges is drying up on account of the long drought.—Joseph Robbins.

Garland, Boxelder.—Warm, windy and dry. Rain would not save the dry land wheat. First crop of lucern is nearly all in the stack. Irrigated grain looks fairly well.—A. H. Gleason.

Vernon, Tooele.—Precipitation has been so light since March that dry wheat is parched beyond recovery. The water in irrigation streams is much lower than usual.—W. H. Purman.

Paradise, Cache.—A very warm week. Dry farm wheat needs rain. Dry farm lucern is nearly all cut and stacked. Lucern on
