These latter will soon all be down, and a great number of wires removed from sight. Connection is being rapidly made between the trunk conduit system on east South Temple street, and

the distribution points north of that thoroughfare, as far as Tenth East. The company installed 174 new phones during the past month.

## PAUPER REPORT.

During Month 237 Families Received Help from the County.

Pauper Clerk Sabine, of the board of county commissioners, has filed his report showing that, during the month of November, \$1,492.95 was distributed among 237 families, consisting of 725 persons. The average amount per family was \$6.30 and the average per person was \$2.09. Of the total number of families 268, consisting of 611 persons resided in the city and 34 families or 114 persons resided in the county outside the city limits.
