than that of grazing. Here and there, however, private enterprise has tapped the mountain streams and irrigated some sections that stand out in contrast, fertile and blooming, and bearing evidences of presperous agriculture. A few villages and hamlets on the route also indicate the efficiency of Mormon industry in building upon waste places, and forcing mother earth to yield abundance, where heretofore barrenness had prevailed. The river Jordan is the outlet of Utab lake, which is 30 miles long, 15 miles wide, and 300 feet above Salt lake, thus forming a natural reservoir, from which it is possible to brigate the entire valley below. The waters of this lake are carried by the Jordan into the Salt lake, a distance of 40 miles. In good time, and with the increase of population that is inevitable, all this region, much of it now lying waste, will be redeemed from barrenness, and converted into rich and fertile farming lands.
