Woman Wants \$30,000 Damages For Two Slaves.

A BOY ACCIDENTALLY SHOT.

Drawn in a Bath—Unintentionally Killed—Hill-Kill—With Paragon.

Lucy, the five-year-old son of Patrick, recently residing at the corner of Main and 1st St., Salt Lake City, was killed by a shot fired from a gun.

The three-year-old boy of George Tavis, of San Francisco, Cal., died Monday night as the result of an overdose of paragon administered by the nurse.

The death of Clara Bredemeyer at San Francisco occurred on Monday. She was a forty-year-old child, a girl in March 14th, with other children, was playing about a fire in a vacant lot near her home. Her mother caught her and she was severely burned.

The San Francisco society of the American Anti-Slavery League adopted a resolution and elected permanent officers at a meeting held Tuesday afternoon in the Young Men's Christian association building. The purpose of the league is the suppression of the slave.

Martha Eleanor Rose of San Jose, Cal., has been ordered by the San Jose Fruit Packing company to \$20,000 damages. James H. Lawrence of San Francisco went to his mother's chest Sunday morning at his home to get some medicine for a slight indisposition. He fell by accident and got hold of the wrong chest and pulled out a quantity of strychnine. He discovered his mistake at once and a physician was sent for. In spite of medicines and the efforts of the physician, however, Leonard died next morning.

Charles C. Carlson, who resided for a time with a family named Sigler, in San Francisco, was taken ill and sent to the city and county hospital, where he remained for a month or two. The Sigler family had taken him and, it is charged, furnished him with strychnine. Monday Carlson signed to the police for a search warrant for the recovery of his personal effects, valued at \$150 and \$25, which he believes the Siglers have made away with.

San Francisco's rainfall to date is about five inches above the total precipitation at this time a year ago. At extreme northern and southern sections the ratio of difference is still greater. Red Bluff, Cal., shows a gain of about six and one-half inches and San Diego of half an inch or less. Oliver Hill, aged 14, was accidentally shot and killed Tuesday morning in the mountains near Ogden, Cal., by Fred Barrett, a companion of his. The boys were spending a week in the country, and took guns along to hunt for game. They went out that morning, Barrett with a .22-caliber rifle and Hill with a .44 gun. They reached the highest part of the mountains and thought they saw a wildcat and prepared to shoot. Barrett was walking ahead with the mule rider on his shoulder. It was dark night, and the mule startled Hill's horse, killing him instantly. The boy was taken to National City, where he died later.

A San Francisco Bohemian, Chivelo N. Brown, drew in his Tuesday afternoon found entangled in the members of a man, identified later as Alvin A. Brown, a Bohemian, another Bohemian, who, with a woman, a boy of 12 years, was crowded off the boat, and in the act of being thrown overboard, the man was thrown into the water and was seen to be struggling. The man's body has not yet been recovered.

If people in California wishing to be believed of existing marital relations do not obtain their divorce before April 28, such persons will have to wait a full twelve months before they will be again eligible to enter upon the marital state. On February 28th Governor Hiram Johnson signed a bill supplementary of section 21 of the civil code, which will take effect May 1st. It provides that the terms of a divorce shall be for a period of twelve months, and that the parties shall be prohibited from marrying during that time.

Up to the present time a second marriage might be contracted when the former marriage had been annulled or dissolved. This provision of the law has been modified by the addition of the following language: "Provided that, in case it be dissolved, the decree of divorce must have been entered and recorded at least a year prior to such subsequent marriage." The object of the change in the law is to put an end, at least a decade, to the abuse of the courts for the sake of changing divorce partners.
