for corns. Tomlinson's Cyclopedia of Useful Arts and Sciences" says: In the south of Europe and in Egypt, etc., grapes are allowed to ripen and dry upon the vine, so as to form raisins.

The sweet grapes which grow upon the sunny, sheltered slopes of hills are preferred. When the fruit is ripe, the grapes are thinned, and the vine is stripped of its leaves. The sun then completes the saccharification and drives off the angueriness water. When the completes the saccharification and drives off the superfluous water. When the bunches are plucked, they are cleaned, dipped for a few seconds in a boiling lye of wood ashes and quick-lime; the wrinkled fruit is then drained and dried, and exposed to the sun upon hurdles for fourteen or fifteen days. The fluest sun raisins are the plumpest bunches left to fully ripen upon the vine, after their stalks have been cut half through. An inferior kind of raisins is prepared by drying the grapes in an oven.
