

Board of Trustees showed the following statistics of attendance during the term:

Total,	300	283

This shows an attendance of 67 students above that of any previous term; besides upwards of 30 applicants being refused admittance to the primary department on account of lack of accommodations. The necessity of more extensive accommodations was urged, stating that already the library room and principal's private office had been used as class rooms.

The principal with his assistants and normal students officiating practically show a total of 18 acting teachers, teaching 70 classes and 320 weekly recitations.

Statistics of Theological department present a register of 2 Seventies, 21 Elders, 9 Priests, 8 Teachers, 44 Deacons, 170 lay members, 16 not baptized, 8 under age, 21 non-members; total, 300. Ordinance record contains registers of 2 baptisms, 2 confirmations, 2 ordinations to priesthood and 2 administrations to sick.

Domestic department report demonstrates the need of a suitable boarding house, organized in connection with the Academy.

According to their places of residence the students are tabulated as follows: Provo, 187; Springville, 11; Spanish Fork, 1; Payson, 2; Goshen, 6; Fairfield, 2; Cedar Fort, 3; Lehi, 1; Alpine, 3; American Fork, 6; Pleasant Grove, 10; Idaho Territory, 1; Salt Lake County, 7; Tooele County, 7; Sanpete County, 4; Sevier County, 2; Millard County, 9; Iron County, 1; Tintic District, 3; Rabbit Valley, 1; Kane County, 5; Washington County, 7—total, 300.

Extract from closing chapter of Report.

"With these items I close my report, and the emotions called forth by a review of the labors and incidents of the past term are not to be expressed in mere words. We only can give thanks to him who has so manifestly taken this institution under his own charge; it therefore has been growing, while obliged to stand on its own feet alone financially; but to all human appearances it has reached the utmost limits of its capacity in space, accommodations and teaching facilities, and what is to be done we do not know as yet, but one thing we know: the Brigham Young Academy will neither go backwards nor even stop in its onward career, with the help of Israel's God. Amen."

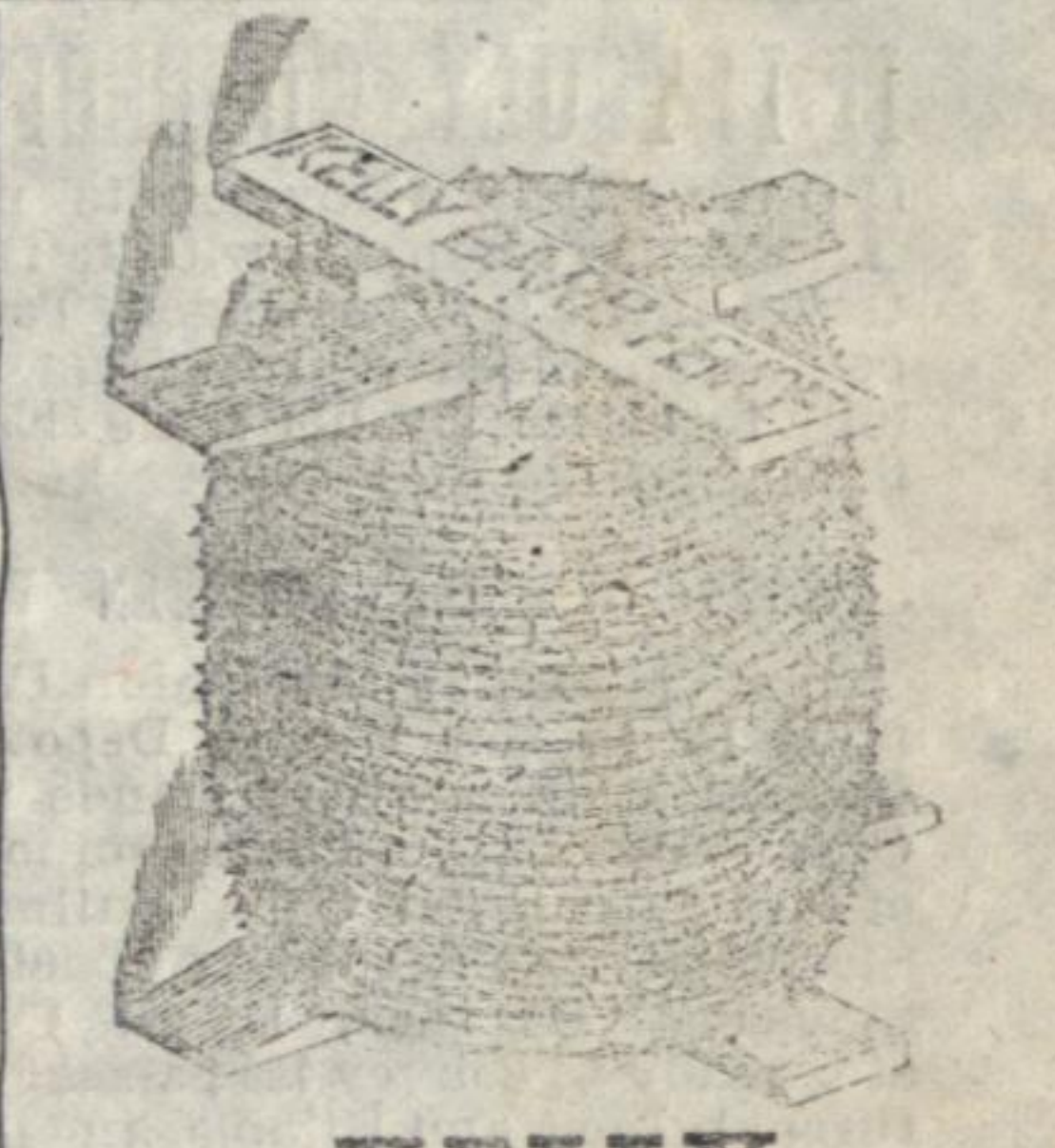

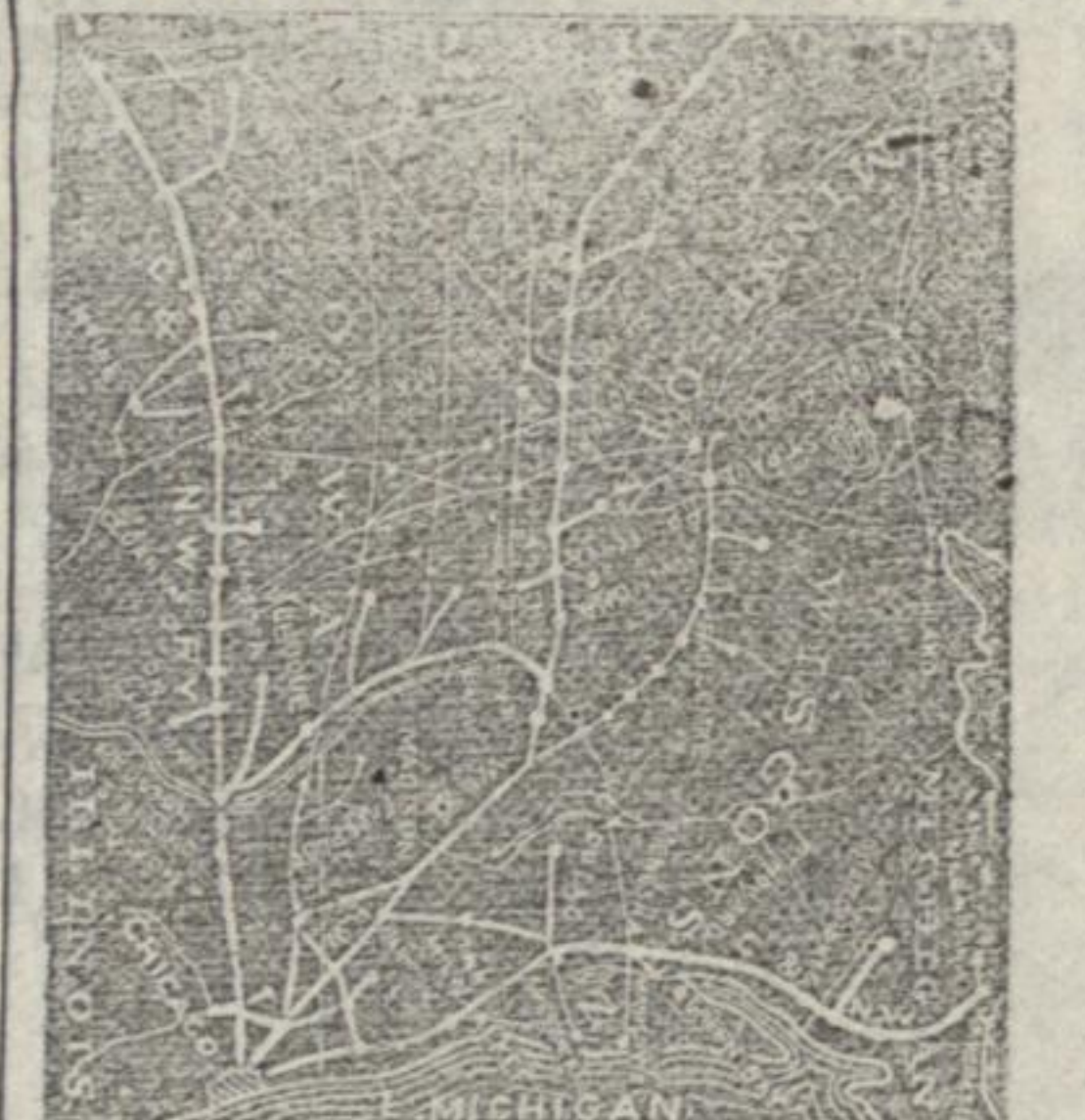
