TARIFF MEASURE

Washington, March 20—As a result of an extended discussion of the necessity of again directing the attention of Congress-to the recommendations of the president looking to legislation amendatory to the Sherman anti-trust law and of other top-ics mentioned in his previous messages, a decision has been reached to send an-other message to Congress within a day or two.

It is said at the White House that the lessage has not been written and that is not now probable that it will be sent o Congress before theintroduction of the vie federation bills by Representative epburn. This statement is based upon the belief that the moral effect of the in-oduction of these bills might be seri-isly imapired if they are preceded by a residential message indicating their ope in advance, thereby reducing them mere forms.
